Impact Story

Sarah (name changed for anonymity) was 20 and had just immigrated to the U.S. from Peru, ready to start a new life with her partner and their unborn baby. But her dream shattered when her partner's words turned to violence. One February day, he brutally attacked her and left her alone in the cold. Bruised and desperate to protect her baby, Sarah remembered she had one thing: a phone number. She called Amoskeag Health.


Our case manager arranged emergency medical care, transportation, and counseling on domestic violence. Sarah was connected to the YWCA for additional support and began trauma counseling with one of our Behavioral Health Clinicians.

Through our partnership with Waypoint, we secured Sarah a spot in their Transitional-Living Parenting program, where she gained stable housing and parenting skills.

Today, Sarah is rebuilding her life in safety, with ongoing case management and resources for her and her baby. Her case manager said, "Amoskeag Health and our community partners empowered Sarah to escape her situation and create a safe, independent future."



Patients by Age


Infant - 5th Grade: 21%

Insurance Coverage


Medicaid: 45%

Jen's journey shows the life-changing support she found at Amoskeag Health:

"After years of struggling with addiction and setbacks, I finally joined Amoskeag Health's Medication-Assisted Treatment program. That decision changed my life. Amoskeag Health has provided a safe place to receive all my care. I see my primary care provider for routine checkups, attend MAT to take care of my behavioral health, and work with my counselor to manage my mental health.

When I became pregnant, I received prenatal care, and now my one-year-old son has a family medicine doctor. I can't stress enough how important the compassion, commitment, and communication from everyone have been during my recovery. Amoskeag Health isn't just a doctor's office; it's a community of meaningful relationships that grew over time."

Jen's story is an excellent example of how comprehensive care and a supportive community can help patients reclaim their lives and build a brighter future.



Medication Assisted Treatment

Our Medication Assisted Treatment (MAT) program helps people recovering from opioid or alcohol use disorders. We combine medication with counseling and other supports to give patients the best chance at long-term recovery.

Our team includes medical providers, nurses, and counselors who work together to create a care plan that fits each person's needs. We offer medications like Suboxone and Vivitrol to ease withdrawal symptoms and cravings, along with regular check-ins to make sure the treatment is working.

Patients can also meet with our licensed alcohol and drug counselor for one-onone, trauma-informed therapy. Our case manager helps with practical needs like housing, benefits, and finding a job, as well as teaching recovery skills and how to prevent relapse. If needed, our medical team provides specialized care and treatment.
